# THE OBJECTIVE OF THE CALL: TO FURTHER THE COLLABORATION BETWEEN VU AMSTERDAM AND THE UT

The Objective of the call is to further the collaboration between the VU Amsterdam and the UT. The call is to:

- all employees to connect education and research;
- to young talent (guideline max. 5-7 years after PhD) to submit a proposal that, if developed/ realised:
  - » will be an impetus for further research;
  - » will be an impetus for commercial knowledge transfer;
  - » will result in a product or service.

If accepted, the budget is intended to cover the expenses for developing/realising the proposal and/or other out-of-pocket costs (such as equipment or other supplies, Open Access publications, graphic design, travel and accommodation costs, etc.).

#### A. CRITERIA

- Proposals that connect education and research have an advantage. These include:
  - Lecturers who provide education in a joint programme and who want to conduct research as well (for more information, see "The research proposal");
  - o Researchers who want to develop a segment of education, such as developing a minor for a joint educational programme.
- The research proposal:
  - o may focus on tapping into **new fields of research**. In that case, the proposal will include a combination of elements, such as working on a special issue (the result will be a **research agenda**), a **pilot study**, organising **workshops**, or **expert meetings** to put VU Amsterdam-UT on the map;
  - o may focus on **business development**:
    - » entering into a partnership with public/private partners (stakeholders), who want to contribute staff/ money/infrastructure, etc. In this case, the result would be a **partnership**;
    - » realising a particular **product** or **service**;
  - may focus on bringing in new research funding. In that case, a consortium can be formed with VU
     Amsterdam-UT as the chair that will submit a funding request to WO/NWA/EU/Zwaartekracht, etc., or smaller funds in the relevant field of study. In this case, the result will be a research proposal;
  - should focus on one of the three themes from the ambition framework: Secure Societies,
     Responsible Societies, or Smart Societies; »



- o is **innovative** and **combines disciplines** from both universities (humanities/exact sciences/social sciences, and engineering and technology; engineering and technology could be a research method, an outcome, or a topic of research);
- o indicates which demonstrable **social contribution** (impact) the result will have.
- The proposal outlines why it aligns with the ambitions of the VU Amsterdam-UT Collaboration;
- Both universities should be a partner in the proposal.

#### **B. PROCEDURE**

- A sum of between €10,000 €35,000 can be requested for a proposal;
- The proposal must be submitted to one of the coalition coordinators before 15 March 2022;
- The coordinators will compile all research proposals;
- The coalition leaders and the coordinators of the coalitions will assess the submitted proposals for each coalition and will advise the VU Amsterdam-UT Steering Committee about this;
- On **7 April, the Steering Committee** will decide which proposals will be honoured. The coordinators of the coalitions will inform the proposers of the decisions;
- The coordinator of the relevant impact coalition **will monitor the progress** of the development/realisation in the interim and will provide the Steering Committee with a brief report;
- The development/realisation must be completed by 1 May 2023 at the latest;
- At the end of the project, a **short report** of the results will be requested.
